

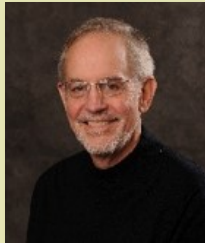
Symposium on Stigma and Mental Health

Room 515, Level 5, 207 Bouverie Street

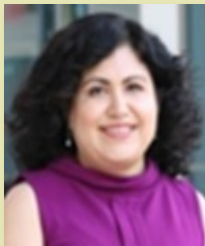
